

- Developed in 1997 as the first state-level USDOE Industries of the Future program.
- Collaboration between WVU, the WV Division of Energy, the WV Development Office and the U.S. Department of Energy.
- Serves as an "umbrella" organization for several industrial assistance programs provided through WVU and WVDOE.
- Tools of IOF-WV are R&D partnerships, training, and energy assessments.



The WVU Industrial Assessment Center



- A U.S. DOE funded program one of 26 Centers across the US – in its 18th year in IAC program.
- Provides assessments not only to USDOE clients but, through WVDOE funding, to West Virginia businesses not otherwise eligible.

Economy, Energy and Environment (E3) Initiative




- E3 is a partnership of state (WVDOE, WVDEP) and Federal agencies (USDOE, USEPA, Commerce, Labor and SBA) to provide technical assessments.
- WVDOE utilizes IOF-WV to provide energy assessments and the West Virginia Manufacturing Extension Partnership (WVMEP) to deliver environmental and carbon management services (carbon footprint analysis).

E3 as a Crosscutting Program Measure



- For the current year, with SEP funding, 24 E3 environmental assessments were conducted in nine months before funding was exhausted.
- The Division of Energy and the WV Department of Environmental Protection's Sustainable Communities provide E3 activities to five selected local communities. The governments and industry receive audits and environmental assessments through EECBG funding.
